

TREE FARM HIGHLIGHTS

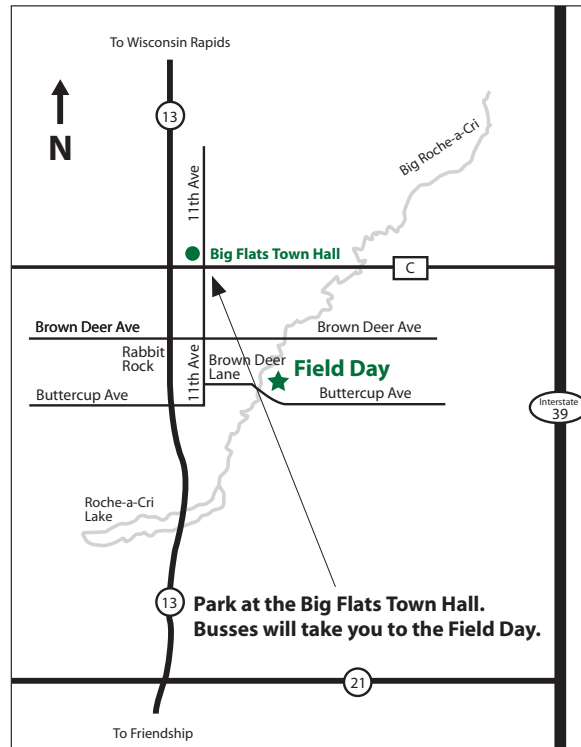
- Family owned since 1955

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- Five rock wing dams were installed to curtail severe bank erosion along the Big Roche-a-Cri with the help of a Wisconsin Conservation Corps crew.
- The property initially consisted of semi-open sandy soils with open sand blows and scattered jack pine, scrub oak and white pine. Throughout the years red and white pine seedlings were hand planted, including 6,500 trees hand-planted to replace losses due to rodent damage and drought.
- Inez and Don were honored by the Wisconsin Woodland Owners Association in 2006 for Educational Outreach Efforts. Don also served as the Public Information officer for the National Tree Farmer Convention held in Wisconsin in October, 2007.

Driving Distances from Major Cities to Adams County, WI

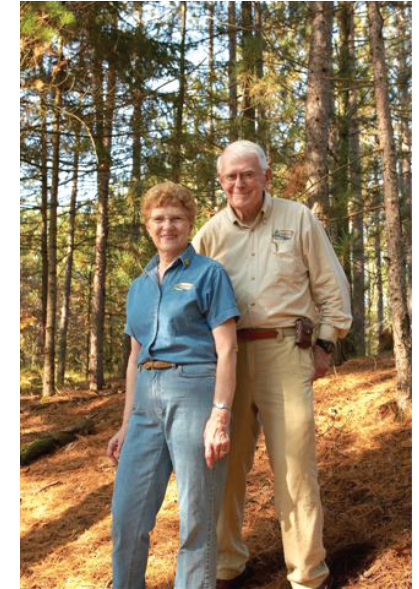
Minneapolis – 210 miles

Meet Inez and Don Krohn, the 2007 Wisconsin Outstanding Tree Farmers of the Year at the Annual Tree Farm Field Day to be held May 31, 2008 at the Roche-a-Cri Tree Farm in Big Flats, Wisconsin.

Talk with Don and Inez about issues affecting Tree Farms as you tour their Tree Farm.

Stops along the tour will include a forest health presentation, land surveying and GPS demonstration, and a songbird habitat and identification seminar.

Other stops will include stream management techniques, a discussion of grants available to forest landowners and the application process, and a talk on marketing your wood resource along with a portable sawmill demonstration.

Coffee and rolls will be provided in the morning. Lunch will be catered. Vendors, including representatives from the forest industry in Wisconsin, conservation groups and state and federal agencies will have display tables at the Big Flats Town Hall.
